

INTRODUCTION

Tea Statistics, published by the Statistics Branch of the Tea Board has already completed 12 years of useful existence and the present issue will be the thirteenth one in the series.

As before, this volume incorporates the latest statistical information relating to different aspects of the Tea Industry and Trade in India and abroad available at the time of going to press. Some of the figures are, therefore, necessarily incomplete or provisional.

The present issue contains 133 tables against 126 tables in the previous issue. Some of the tables have also been reoriented according to present needs. The seven additional tables in the present issue are as mentioned below :

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The increasing statistical requirements for a scientific and systematic study of the various problems arising in the production and marketing of tea has made it imperative on us to add more and more new tables to this publication. Even so, there are obviously many other aspects about which we have not yet been able, due to various reasons, to include as much detailed information as would be desirable. As India is a member of the Consultative Committee set up at the last F.A.O. meeting on Tea held at London in February, 1967 and as the undersigned was the Convener of the Sub-Committee appointed by the London Meeting to identify the statistical requirements for study of all aspects of Tea as a commodity of international trade and as a crop of primary importance to the developing producing countries and also to suggest the steps and measures necessary for collection, analysis and interpretation of such statistics in the light of the varying supply/demand matrix and the unstable marketing conditions, we have always been conscious of the need for expanding the

scope and coverage of this publication as best as possible under the existing circumstances. We will no doubt continue our efforts in this direction.

Comments and suggestions for improvement of this publication will be thankfully received and carefully considered.

Review of the Year 1966-67

The year 1966 has been significant for the Tea Industry in many respects. Most important of them is the fact that production of tea reached an all-time record of 374.8 m.kg. registering an increase of 8.4 m.kg. over the previous year. The second important phenomenon which had a profound effect on tea exports as well as prices is the devaluation of the Indian rupee with effect from 6th June, 1966. Though devaluation was expected to give a fillip to tea exports by making Indian tea cheaper to foreign buyers, this did not actually materialise. Re-imposition of the export duty-abolished since 1st March, 1963— at the rate of Rs. 2/- per kg., simultaneously with devaluation, was another factor that had an adverse effect on exports of Indian tea. These, together with some other adverse circumstances, accounted for the export performance in 1966 having been unsatisfactory and much below the level at which it could otherwise have been.

The position regarding production, exports, sales, internal consumption, duties etc. is discussed below :—

Production : With a production of 374.8 m.kg. in 1966, India continues to be the biggest producer in the world. It is heartening to note that in the first year of the 4th Five-year Plan total production of tea in India recorded a satisfactory increase over the previous year. The previous record was 372.5 m.kg. in 1964. It is also gratifying to note that the increase in production in 1966, as compared to 1965, was shared by both North India and South India almost in proportion to their normal share in the total production. In fact, production in South India steadily increased from 82.5 m.kg. in 1964 to 93.1 m.kg. in 1965, and further to 95.4 m.kg. in 1966. Production figures for North India and South India for the last 3 years are given below :—

Exports : Tea exports from India fell from 199.4 m.kg. valued at Rs. 115.0 crores in 1965 to 179.2 m.kg. valued at Rs. 137.5 crores (Rs. 98.8 crores in pre-devaluation terms) in 1966, thus recording a decline of 20.2 m.kg. in quantum and Rs. 16.2 crores (in pre-devaluation terms) in foreign exchange earnings.

A redeeming feature, however, was that in spite of decline in total exports during

1966 there was improvement in our exports to a number of countries viz. U.A.R., Sudan, Iraq, Afghanistan and Australia. Exports to these countries in 1966 as compared to 1965 are shown below :—

Exports to West Germany, Netherlands and Canada were practically of the same order as in 1965 but the most distressing feature of 1966 was the decline in exports to U.S.S.R. which had been steadily increasing her imports of Indian tea in recent years as well as to the traditional markets like the U.K., U.S.A., Irish Republic, Canada and Iran. The decline had been very sharp in our exports to U.K. and U.S.S.R.—from 104.2 m.kg. in 1965 to 87.2 m.kg. in 1966 in the case of the former, and from 26.2 m.kg. in 1965 to 16.9 m.kg. in 1966 in the case of the latter.

Simultaneously with devaluation of the rupee, the tax credit scheme for exports was withdrawn, and an export duty of Rs. 2/- per kilogram was imposed on tea. An immediate effect of devaluation was that purchases by U.S.S.R., the East European countries and U.A.R. came to a standstill for nearly 2 months; and it was only after new protocols for re-valuation of old rupee contracts were entered into towards the end of July, that exports to these countries began moving again. Even so, for the whole year, exports to these countries, particularly to U.S.S.R., remained sluggish. Strikes in tea gardens in North Bengal, go-slow tactics adopted by the dock labour in Calcutta Port and their eventual strike as well as a strike by transport workers in Calcutta in August/September, 1966, also affected exports very badly. The imposition of an export duty at a flat rate of Rs. 2/- per kg. also had an adverse effect on exports, particularly of common teas, for which the benefit from devaluation was more or less nullified by the heavy export duty imposed coupled with abolition of the tax credit scheme as well as increase in ocean freight and other charges as a result of the devaluation.

The flat rate of export duty was replaced with effect from 11th November, 1966 by an ad valorem-cum-slab system of export duty according to which teas of the value upto Rs. 4 per kg. had to bear a duty of 80 paise per kg. against the previous rate of Rs. 2 per kg. The duty progressively increased to the maximum rate of Rs. 3 per kg. for teas valued at Rs. 12 and above. This brought considerable relief, particularly to low priced teas. However, the method of levying export duty under the ad valorem-cum-slab system proved very cumbersome, and involved very detailed documentation by exporters, and delayed the shipment of tea for some time. It was not until the middle of December that there was a noticeable improvement in the pace of shipments. This improvement in the pace of shipment continued till the end of the last financial year. As a result, much of the shortfall in exports during the year 1966 was made up, and total exports from India during the fiscal year 1966-67 stood at 190.4 m.kg. valued at Rs. 102.3 crores (in pre-devaluation terms) compared to 197.4 m.kg. valued at Rs. 114.8 crores in 1965-66.

In addition to what has been stated above, a factor which affected exports to U.K. in

1966 in some measure was the continued credit squeeze in that country. The export performance of Indian tea during calendar year 1966 and financial year 1966-67 compared to the previous year is given below :—

Sales : The total quantities of leaf and dust teas sold at Calcutta auctions during 1966-67 season were 102.8 m.kg. and 55.8 m.kg. respectively against 99.6 m.kg. and 55.3 m.kg. in 1965-66. The quantity of tea sold at Cochin auctions during 1966 was 59.6 m.kg. against 52.7 m.kg. sold during 1965. At London auctions 65.6 m.kg. of North Indian teas and 8.8 m.kg. of South Indian teas were sold during 1966 against 73.7 m.kg. and 12.3 m.kg. It will be seen that larger quantities were sold through both Calcutta and Cochin auctions in 1966 than in 1965. The quantity of Indian tea sold through London auctions was lower in 1966 by 11.6 m.kg. than in 1965.

Coonoor and Amritsar auctions continued to operate satisfactorily during the year.

The quantities of tea sold through different auctions in 1965 and 1966 are shown below :—

It will be seen from the above that 79.3 per cent of the crop was sold through auctions in 1966 as against 81.6 per cent in 1965. The proportions sold through auctions in 1963 and 1964 were 81.5% and 80.2% respectively. The balance sold otherwise is broken up as follows :—

It will be seen that the average prices of leaf and dust teas sold in Calcutta auctions in 1966-67 season were higher by 30 p. and 23 p. respectively as compared to the prices obtained in 1965-66. Average prices of leaf and dust teas sold at Cochin auctions during 1966 were, however, lower by 5 p. and 2 p. respectively compared to the prices realised in 1965. Prices of North Indian and South Indian teas sold in London auctions during 1966 were also below the corresponding prices realised in 1965. It will also be seen that the price decline has been much higher for South Indian teas—at both Cochin and London—than for North Indian teas.

Duties: There have been a number of changes in the fiscal measures in the budget for 1967-68 as given below. The changes in export duty in 1966-67 have been indicated earlier.

II. Export duty (with effect from 25.5.67)

III. New Cess on tea imposed (with effect from 10.6.67)

A new cess at the rate of 4 paise per kg. has been imposed on all teas produced in India with effect from 10.6.67. This replaces the cess at the rate of 4.4 paise per kg. hitherto levied only on teas exported.

IV. Relief to Package tea export (with effect from 7th August, 1967).

Instant Tea : Instant tea has been exempted from export duty with effect from 22nd July, 1967.

Internal Consumption : Internal consumption of tea in India has been steadily increasing. It increased from 82.7 m.kg. in 1953-54 to 139.6 m.kg. in 1961-62. Owing to lower crop and higher exports in 1962 and 1963, domestic consumption of tea was slightly lower at 135.7 m.kg. in 1962-63. There was again a recovery in 1963-64, when it reached the level

of 140.7 m.kg. It rose further to 149.0 m.kg. in 1964-65 and again to 166.0 m.kg. in 1965-66. The estimated internal consumption of tea in India for the last five fiscal years is as follows :—

Targets for 4th Five-Year Plan : The targets for production and exports suggested by the Working Group on Tea have now been finally fixed by a Committee appointed by the Government. This Committee reviewed the situation in the light of the actual performance in production and exports during the last 2 years of the 3rd Five-year Plan period and recommended that the targets for production and export for the 4th Five-year Plan should be fixed at 420 m.kg. and 240 m.kg. respectively in place of 454 m.kg. (1000 m.lbs.) and 295 m.kg. (650 m.lbs.) originally recommended by the Working Group on Tea. The Committee was of the opinion that the original targets were on the high side when judged in the light of actual performance in the recent past. The recommendations of the Committee have been accepted by the Government of India. The targets for production and exports for the 3rd and the 4th Five year Plans are shown below :—

It will be seen from the above that the production target envisages an increase of 54 m.kg. in production and 40.6 m.kg. in export over the actual performance in 1965.

World Supply and Absorption : According to provisional estimates, total supply of tea during 1966 was 823 m.kg., while total world consumption was 820 m.kg., leaving a nominal surplus of 3 m.kg. It will thus be seen that total world supply and consumption continue to be balanced.

The position of supply and consumption of tea in the world for 1965 and 1966 is given below :—

It will be seen from the above figures that world production and consumption increased by 1.98 per cent and 1.49 per cent respectively in 1966 over the previous year.

Ad-hoc Meeting of Tea at London : A Delegation consisting of Shri Bhagwan Singh, Chairman, as leader, and Shri P. R. Sengupta, Statistician and Shri K. M. Kidwai, Director of Tea Promotion (London) as members, attended the Second Ad-hoc Consultation of Tea held at London on the 20th to 28th February, 1967. This meeting was convened in pursuance of the decision taken at the first meeting in Ceylon to consider the World Tea Situation and the desirability of setting up of a Tea Study Group as well as the need for introducing some form of regulation on production and/or exports. The consensus of opinion at the meeting was that there was no immediate likelihood of any sizeable surplus of tea arising in the near future and as such there was no need of setting up a Tea Study Group. Regulation, in any form, of either production or export was also considered unnecessary. It was, however, decided that another Consultation should be held after about 12 months. In the meantime, the F.A.O. should collect more comprehensive data on different aspects of production and consumption of tea and undertake a number of studies in accordance with the decisions taken at this Consultation.

The meeting also appointed a Sub-Committee on Statistics with Shri P. R. Sengupta as Convener to revise, enlarge and modify the questionnaire which was drafted by the Meeting on Statistics held in Rome in March, 1966 in the light of the comments and suggestions received from different producing and importing countries. The revised questionnaire along with certain other recommendations of the Sub-Committee regarding collection of statistics on different aspects of production and consumption of tea were adopted at the meeting.

A Consultative Committee consisting of the United Kingdom, India and Uganda was also set up to advise the F.A.O. in carrying out the studies referred to above.

The Budget for 1967-68 envisages an increase of excise duty on tea in general for all Zones. But there has also been a corresponding reduction in the export duty. The new rates of Central excise duty and export duty effective from 25.5.67 are given as follows :—

(iv) Relief granted to Co-operative and Bought leaf tea factories

The Ministry of Finance in their notifications dated 4th July, 1967 has granted a concession in the rate of Excise duty payable by co-operative and Bought leaf tea factories.

Cooperative factories are to be exempted from 10% of the Basic Excise duty and from the whole of Special Excise duty while other Bought leaf factories are exempted from the whole of the Special Excise duty only. This replaces the previous orders which came into effect from 27th Nov. 1965.

(v) Exemption of instant tea from the Payment of Export duty

Instant tea is exempted from Export duty with effect from 22nd July, 1967.

(vi) Relief to Package tea export with effect from 7th August, 1967

28. Taxes and duties on Tea in EFTA, EEC and other countries.

(A) EFTA (European Free Trade Association)

1. U. K. ... There is no import duty on teas of Commonwealth origin. Teas from other countries had to pay an import duty of 2d per lb. upto 1963 but U.K. has suspended this import duty with effect from 1st January, 1964. There is no other tax on tea in UK.
2. Norway ... Until 31. 12. 63 there was an import duty of 2.00 N. Kroner or Rs. 1.33 per kg of tea imported into Norway. This duty was suspended with effect from 1.1.64. There is also a turn over tax of 10% ad valorem—about 30 P per lb. for teas with a c.i.f. value of Rs. 3.00 per lb.—which is presumably still in force.
3. Sweden ... The import duty on tea was one kroner or Re. 0.50 per kg up to 31st December, 1963. The Swedish Government has abolished duty on tea in bulk as well as Packet tea with effect from 1.1.64. In Sweden there is now a duty of 10% ad valorem on instant tea only. The duty on coffee has also been abolished from 1.1.64.
4. Denmark ... There was an import duty of 270 ore or Rs. 1.86 per kg upto 31.12.63. This duty has, however, been suspended with effect from 1.1.64.
5. Switzerland ... Until 31.12.63 there was an import duty of 1 franc or Rs. 1.09 per kg for tea in packages of over 5 kg and 1.50 francs or Rs. 1.63 per kg on packages under 5 kg. The Swiss Government has abolished completely all Customs duties on tea i.e. both loose and packet teas with effect from 1st January, 1964.
6. Austria ... There was a Customs duty of A Sch. 1,300 per 100 kg or Rs. 2.38 per kg and if tea is packed in 1 kg packages or less there is an additional tax of 30 per cent of the duty or 16.90A. Sch. per kg Austria has abolished the import duty on tea from May 15, 1964. The duty on package tea has also been reduced from 16.90 shillings to 10 shillings per kg from May 15th, 1964.
7. Portugal ... Import duty—Maximum Tariff is 72,00 Escudos per kg or Rs. 11.86 per kg or Rs. 5.38 per lb. and the minimum Tariff is 36,00 Escudes per kg or Rs. 5.93 per kg. Maximum tariff is applicable to countries with which there is no trade agreement or any commercial treaty. Minimum Tariff is applicable to goods originating in countries to which such regime is granted by a Commercial treaty or by a Statutory provision. There is also a preferential duty on tea at 22.5% for Colonial territories.

(B) EEC (European Economic Countries)

SUSPENSION OF IMPORT DUTY ON TEA IN EEC COUNTRIES WITH EFFECT FROM 1.1.64

The Council of Ministers of the European Economic Community decided at their meeting held on 30.7.63 to suspend for two years the Common external tariff on tea from the provisional rate of 18% ad-valorem to Zero on bulk teas and to reduce the duty on packet teas i.e. packets containing 3 kg or less from 23% to 5% ad-valorem with effect from 1st January, 1964. All the member states in EEC have implemented this decision with effect from 1st January, 1964.

In spite of the suspension of the duty on loose tea by EEC from 1.1.64. there are still high imposts of Internal taxes on tea in some of the member states as shown below :—

1. Irish Republic ... No import duty is levied on tea imported from Commonwealth Countries. Teas from other countries as well as teas from Commonwealth origin that have undergone any process of blending outside the country of origin are, however, subject to import duty of 2d per lb.
2. Finland ... The Finish Government has abolished duty on bulk tea and reduced duty on Packet tea to 10% with effect from 1. 1. 64. The duty levied by Finish Government on tea prior to 1. 1. 64 has been Finish Marks 1.50 or Rs. 2.214 per kg.
3. Greece ... Rate of duty prior to 1. 1. 64—600 Drachma per 100 kg. or 96 paise per kg of tea. Rate of duty after 1. 1. 64—512 Drachma per 100 kg. or 82 paise per kg. of tea.
4. Yugoslavia ... General duty 32%, Preferential duty 25%.
5. U. S. A. ... There is no import duty on tea imported into the United States but all teas must be examined at the port of entry for purity, quality and fitness for consumption according to Government Standards fixed each year by the U. S. Govt. department of Agriculture.
6. Canada ... Tea from British Commonwealth countries is admitted duty free. Existing Custom tariffs on teas imported from countries to which most favoured nation tariffs and general tariffs were applicable have been eliminated from 21st December, 1963 by the Govt. of Canada. Prior to the above amendment, in Most Favoured Nation tariff was 2 cents or about 9 P per lb. and general tariff 8 cents or about 38 P per lb.
7. Australia ... Customs duties have been completely removed from tea imported in bulk and there would also be a reduction of 3d per lb. in the duties on packaged teas not exceeding 20 lb. net with effect from 31st March, 1964 i.e. duty on packet teas not exceeding 20 lb. net per lb. is 2d or Re. 0.09 per lb. Prior to the above amendment import duty on tea in Australia was 5d per lb. or Rs. 0.49 per kg. or Rs. 0.22 per lb. on packages not exceeding 20 lb. net and 3d per lb. or Re. 0.29 per kg. or Re. 0.13 per lb. on bulk tea in excess of 20 lb. net.
8. New Zealand ... Customs duty on bulk tea has been completely eliminated. The reduction of duty on tea in packages of less than 5 lb. net by 1d per lb. to 2d British Preference, 3d Most Favoured Nation and 4d General tariff rates. These reductions have come into force on 12th June, 1964. Prior to this date duties on tea were as follows:—

9. Iran ... The import duty on tea is Rials 31 or Rs. 1.97 per kg. or Re. 0.89 per lb. Commercial Profit tax of Rials 14 per kg. (reduced from Rials 30 to Rials 14 per kg. in 1963) or Re. 0.89 per kg. or Re. 0.40 per lb. Monopoly tax of 5.70 Rials or Re. 0.36 per kg. or Re. 0.16 per lb. and special Municipal tax of 3 Rials or Re. 0.19 per kg. or Re. 0.09 per lb. Total incidence of taxes in Iran—Rs. 3.41 per kg. or Rs. 1.54 per lb.
- The Govt. of Iran has passed a decree on 2nd October, 1963 making imports of foreign tea from all countries free into Iran without any conditions except that the normal import tax and Customs duties are to be paid and the existing blending regulations are to be adhered to.
10. Iraq ... There is import duty of Rs. 1.13 Per kg. or Re. 0.51 per lb.
11. Turkey ... The import duty on tea is 75% advalorem.
12. Saudi Arabia ... The import duty on 'Black tea' is 6% advalorem and on Green tea is 10% advalorem.
13. Sudan ... The Import duty is Rs. 1.36 per kg. or Rs. 0.62 per lb.
14. U.A.R. ... There is an import duty of 50% advalorem with a minimum of £ 0.20 E per kg. or Rs. 2.27 per kg. or Rs. 1.03 per lb., a statistical duty of 5% and a paving duty of 2% of the total of the import and statistical duties.
15. Ethiopia ... Import duty on bulk tea in Ethiopia has been increased from Rs. 3.83 Per kg. to Rs. 5.75 per kg. and on tea packets or tins from Rs. 4.79 per kg. to Rs. 6.71 Per kg.
16. Lebanon ... Import duty on tea in Lebanon entering from India is:—
- (i) Tea in packets of 1 kg. or less is 120 Piastres per kilo gross.
- (ii) Others is 60 Piastres per kilo nett.
17. Morocco ... Import duty on tea—32% advalorem or Rs. 1.64 per kg. on unit value of Rs. 5.14 Consumption tax—98 Francs or 91 paise per kg. Total incidence on 1963 unit value—(Rs. 5.14 per kg.)=Rs. 2.55 per kg.
18. Japan ... Levies 35% advalorem duty on imports of tea.

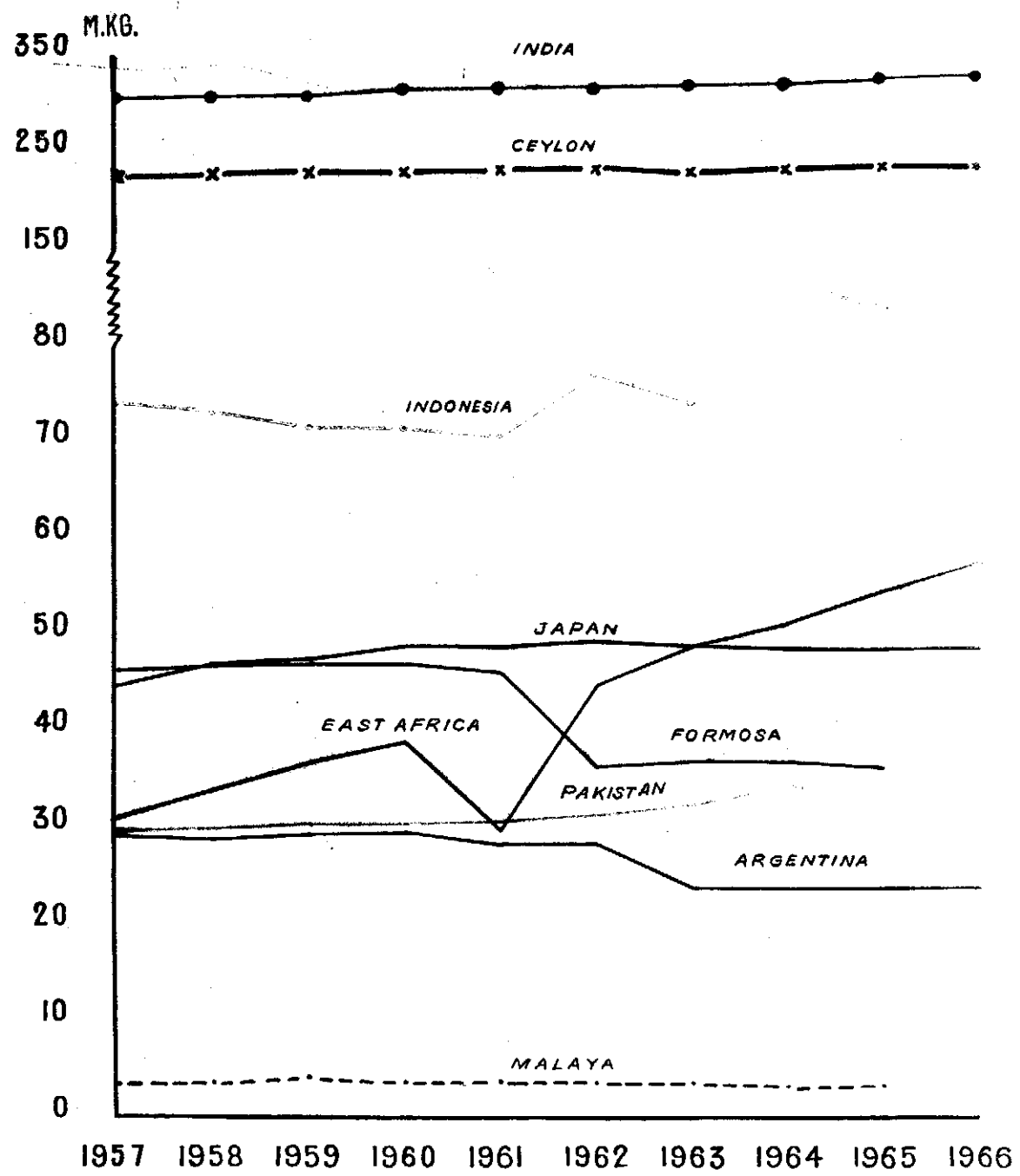

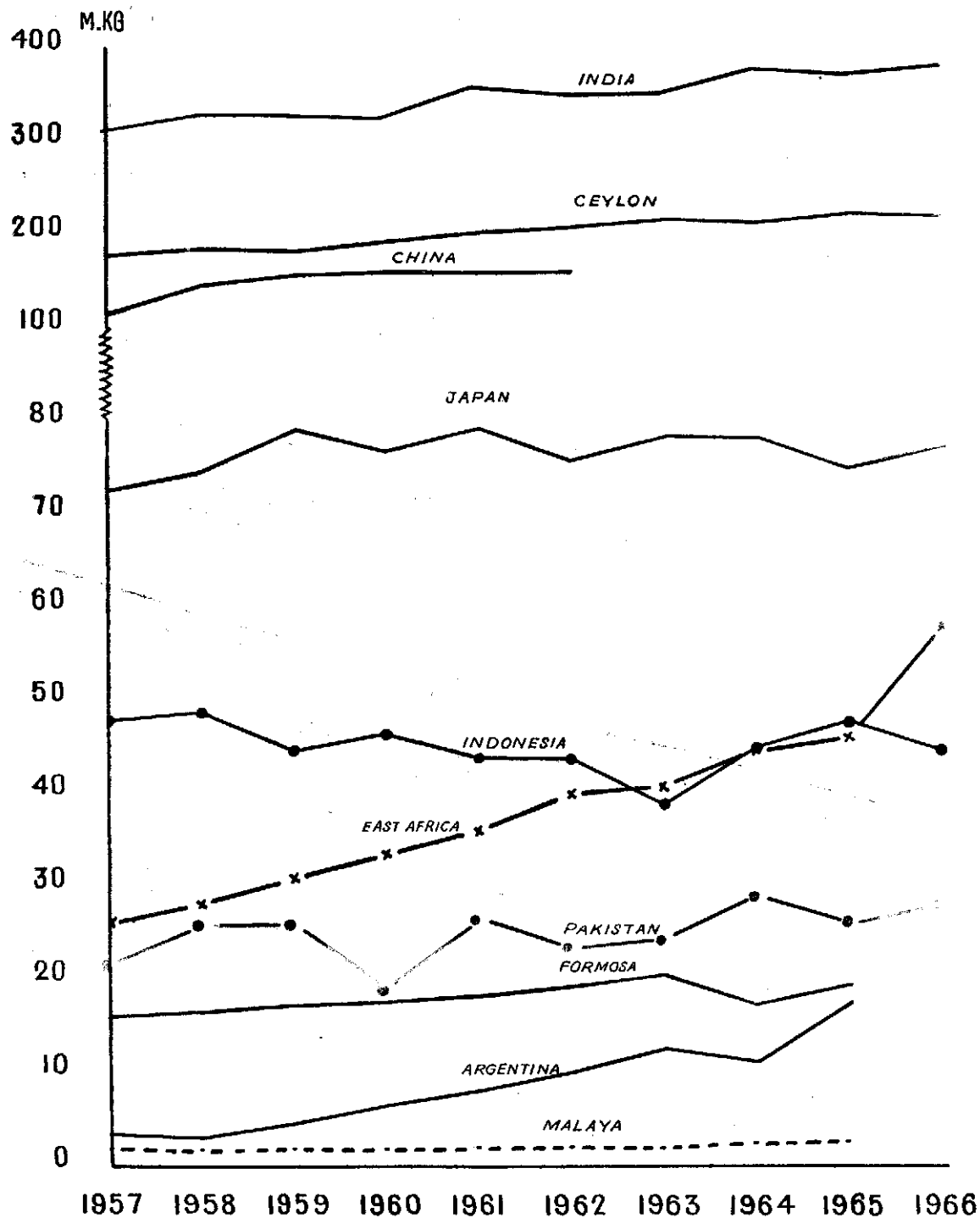

1. AREA PLANTED WITH TEA IN PRINCIPAL PRODUCING COUNTRIES.



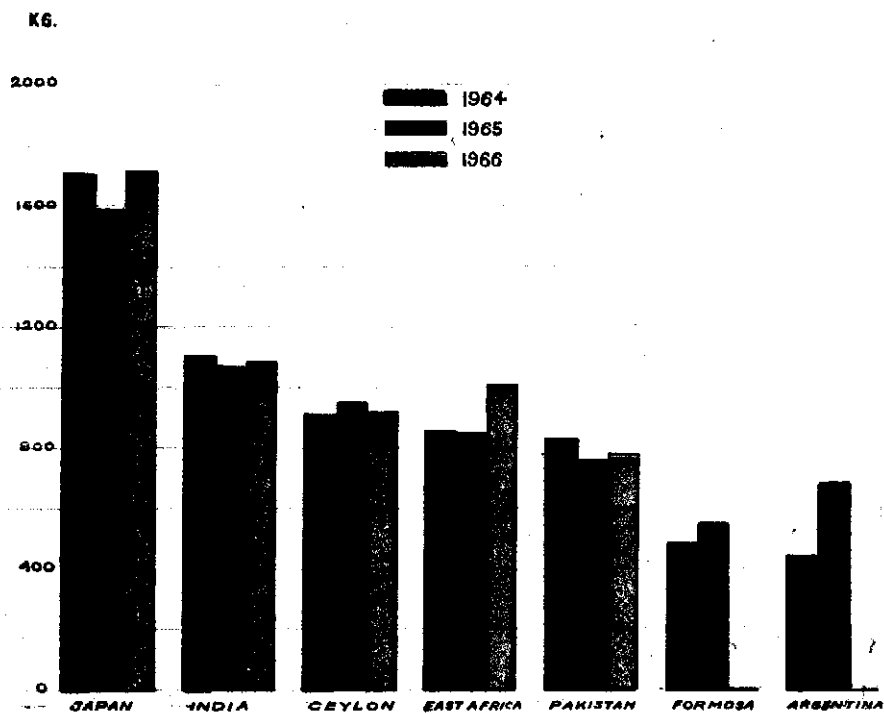

2. PRODUCTION OF TEA IN PRINCIPAL PRODUCING COUNTRIES



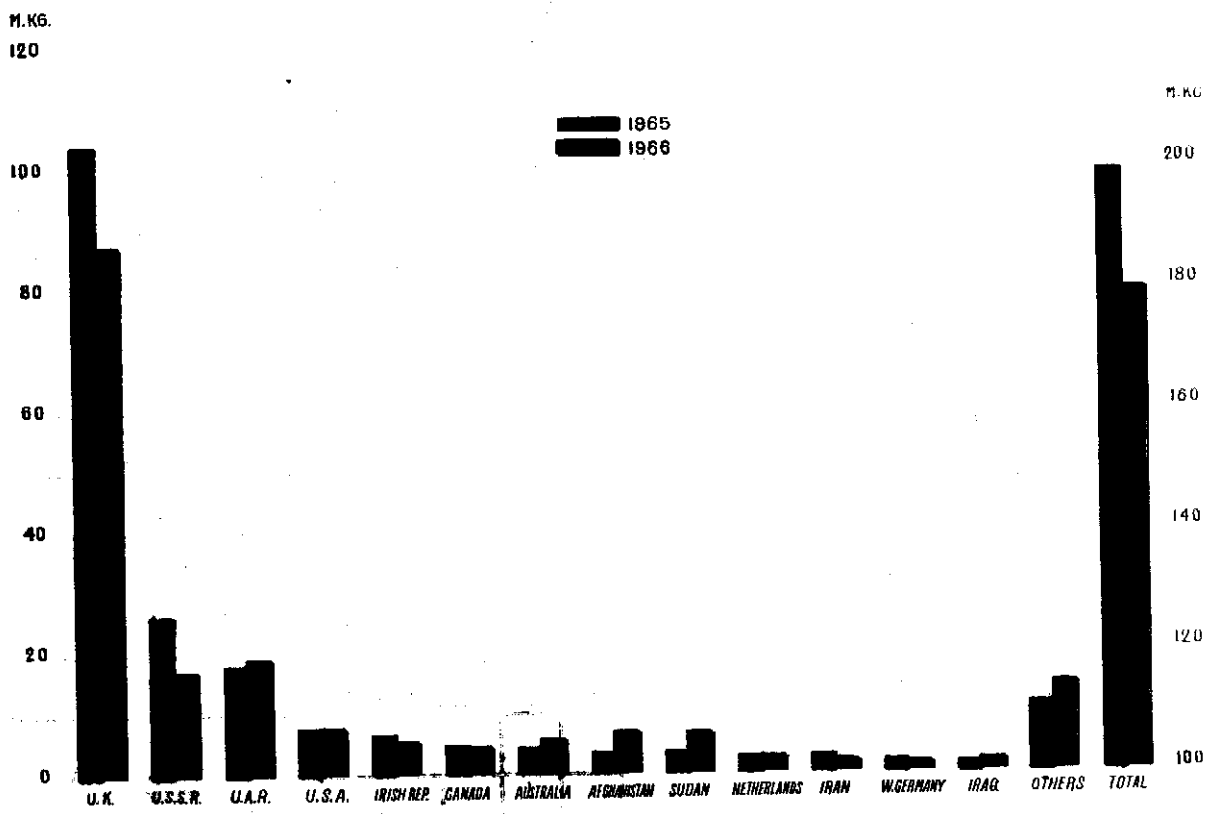

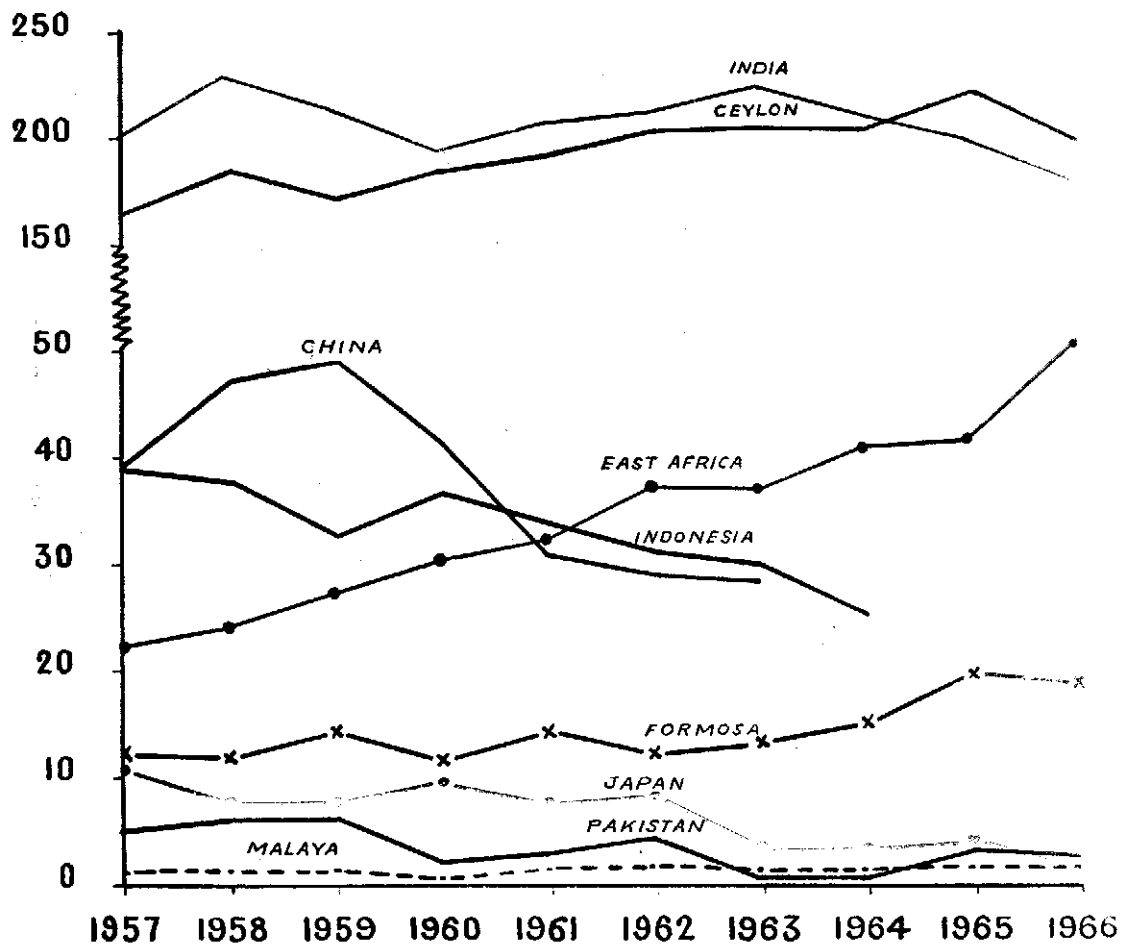
4. EXPORTS OF INDIAN TEA TO DIFFERENT COUNTRIES DURING 1965 AND 1966.



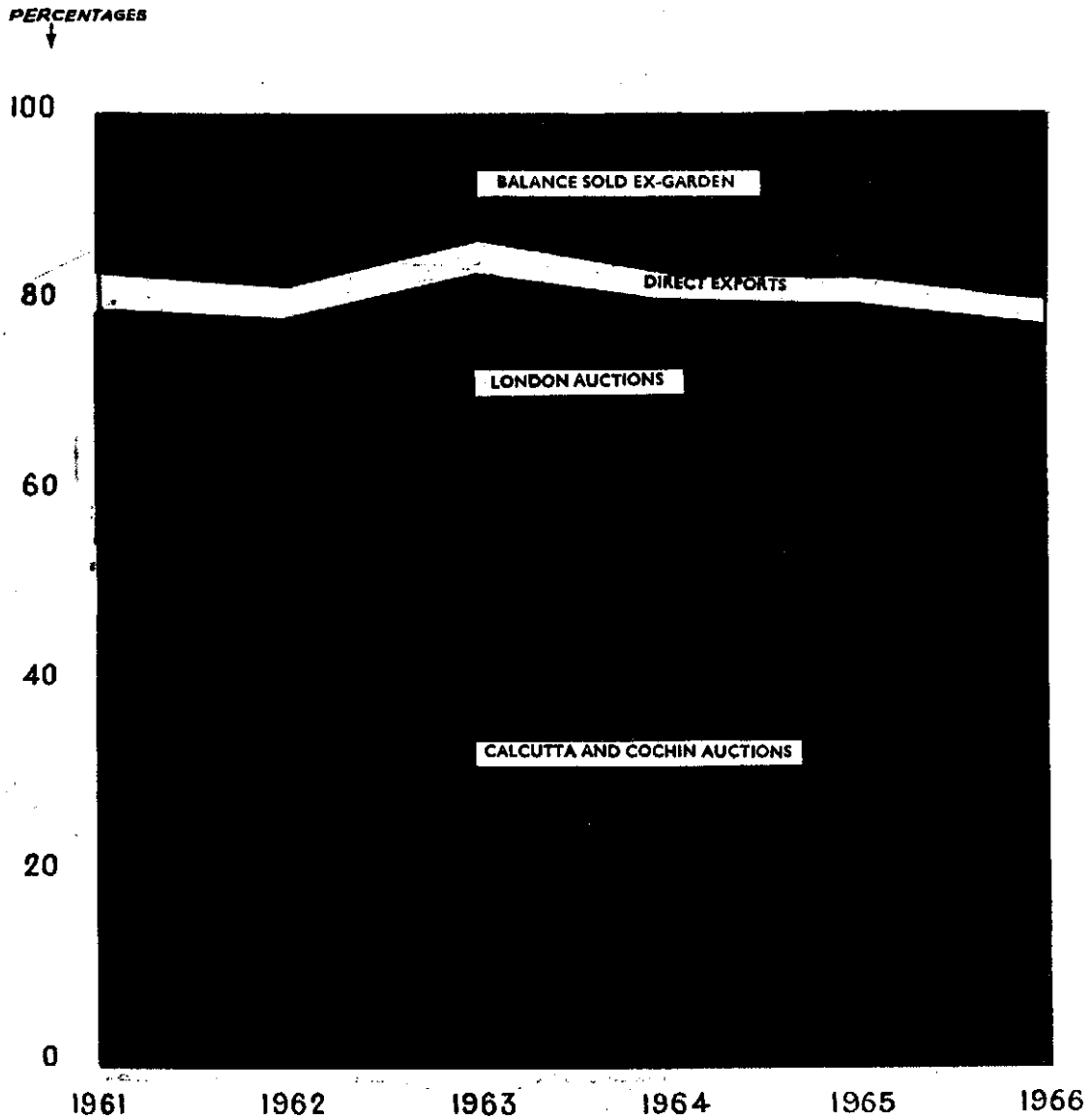

5. TOTAL EXPORTS OF TEA FROM PRINCIPAL PRODUCING COUNTRIES

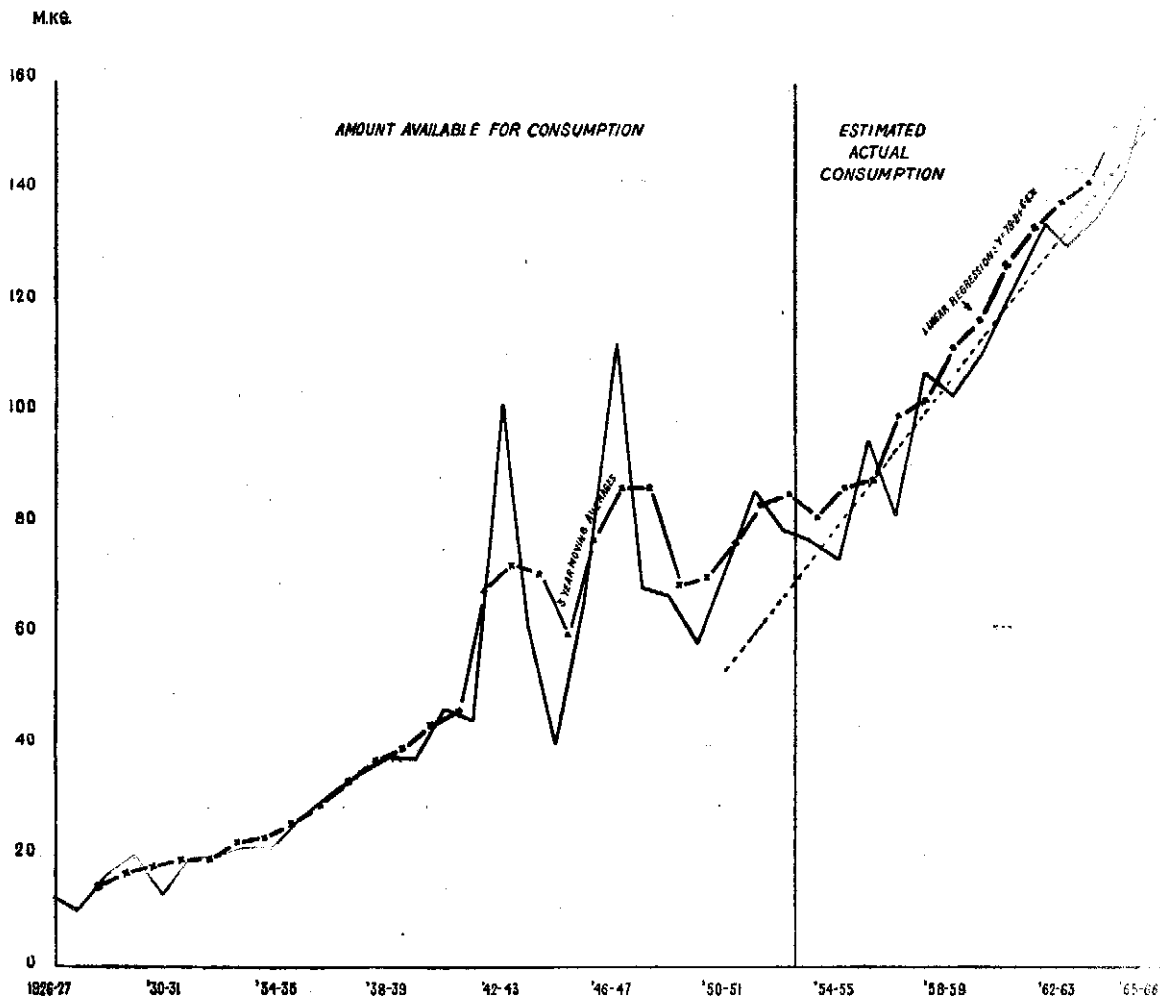

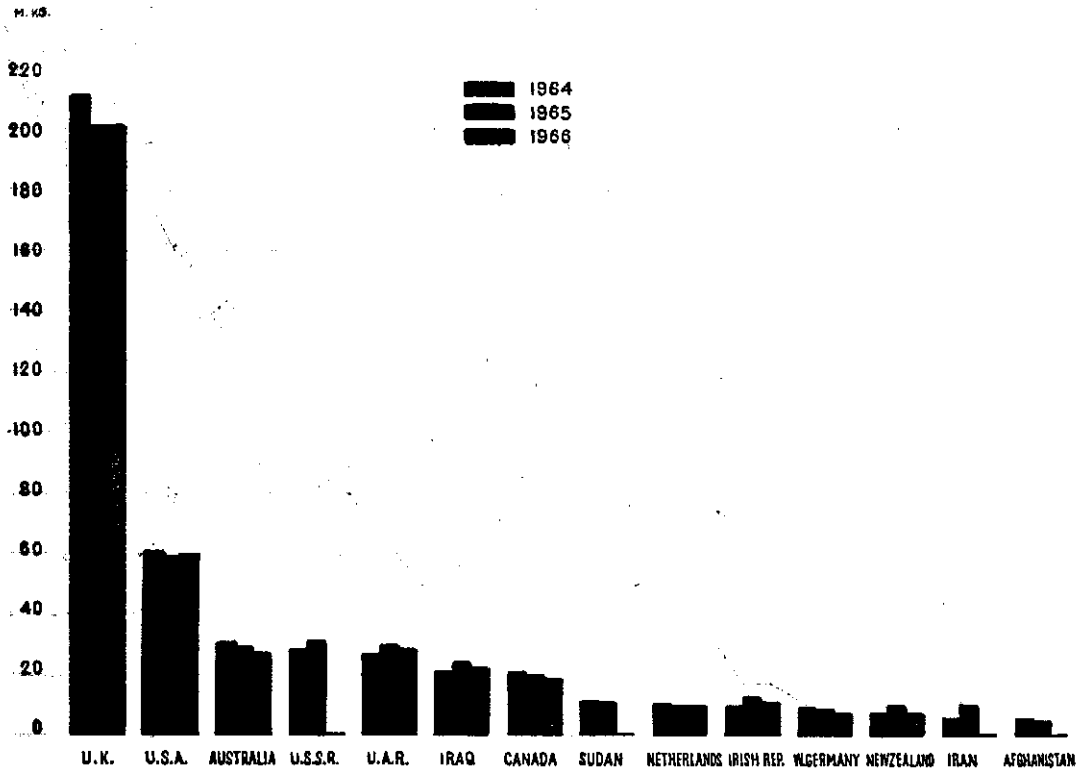

7. INTERNAL CONSUMPTION OF TEA IN INDIA

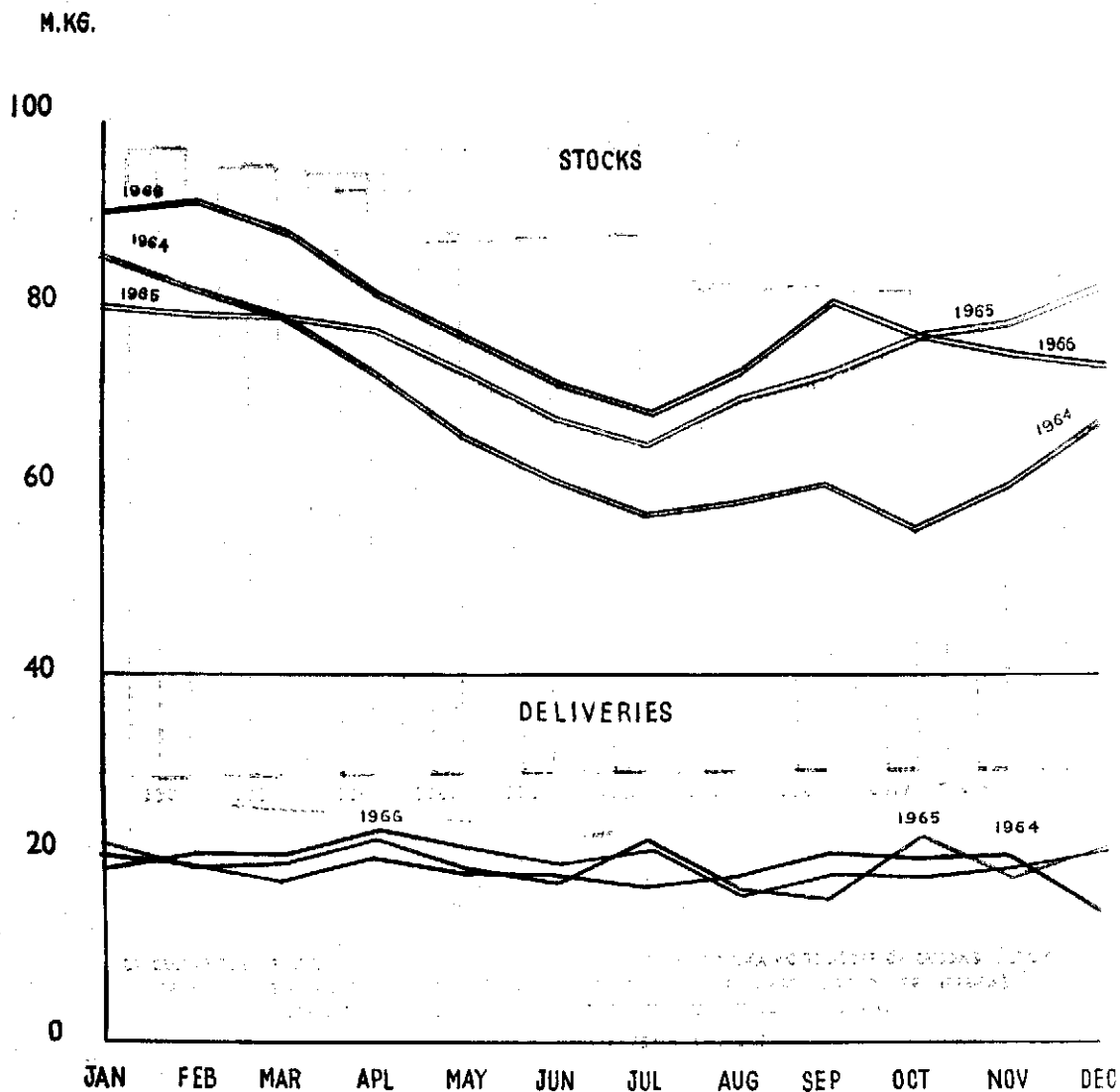


8. TEA IMPORTS FOR CONSUMPTION IN DIFFERENT COUNTRIES.



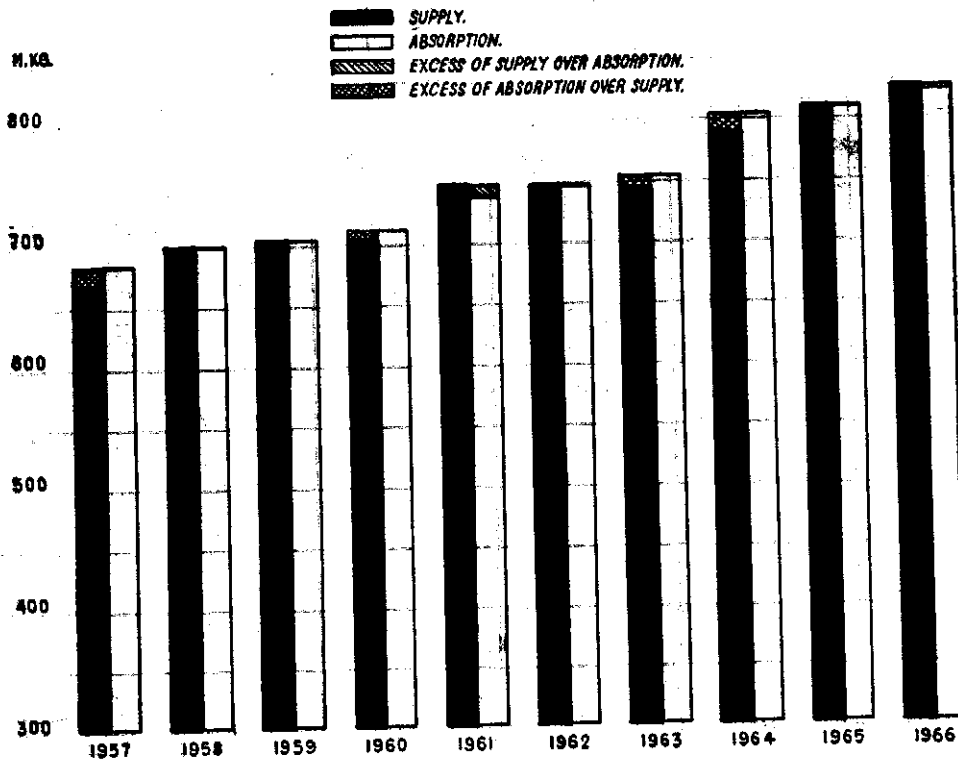

10. TREND OF WORLD SUPPLY AND ABSORPTION.

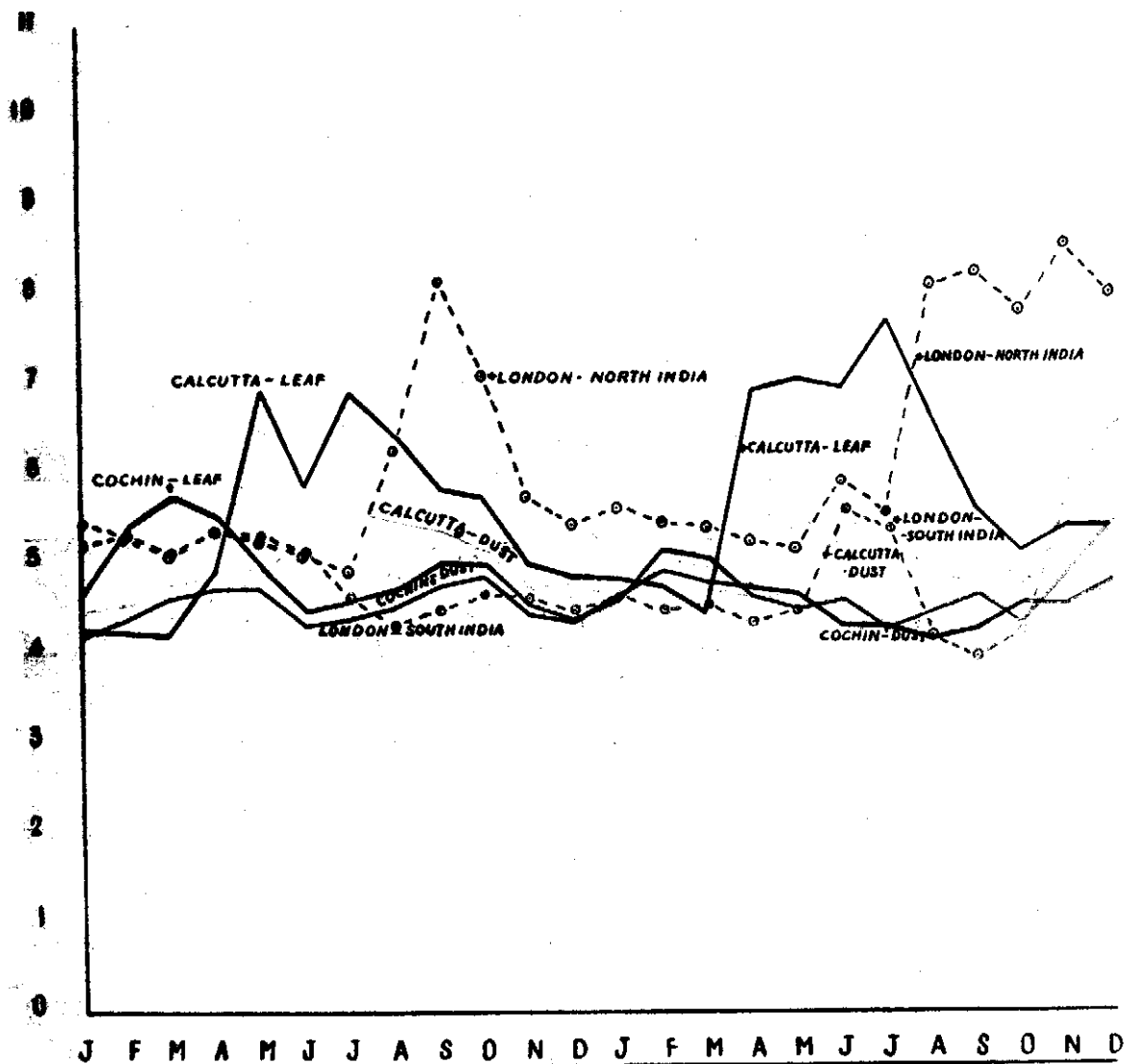

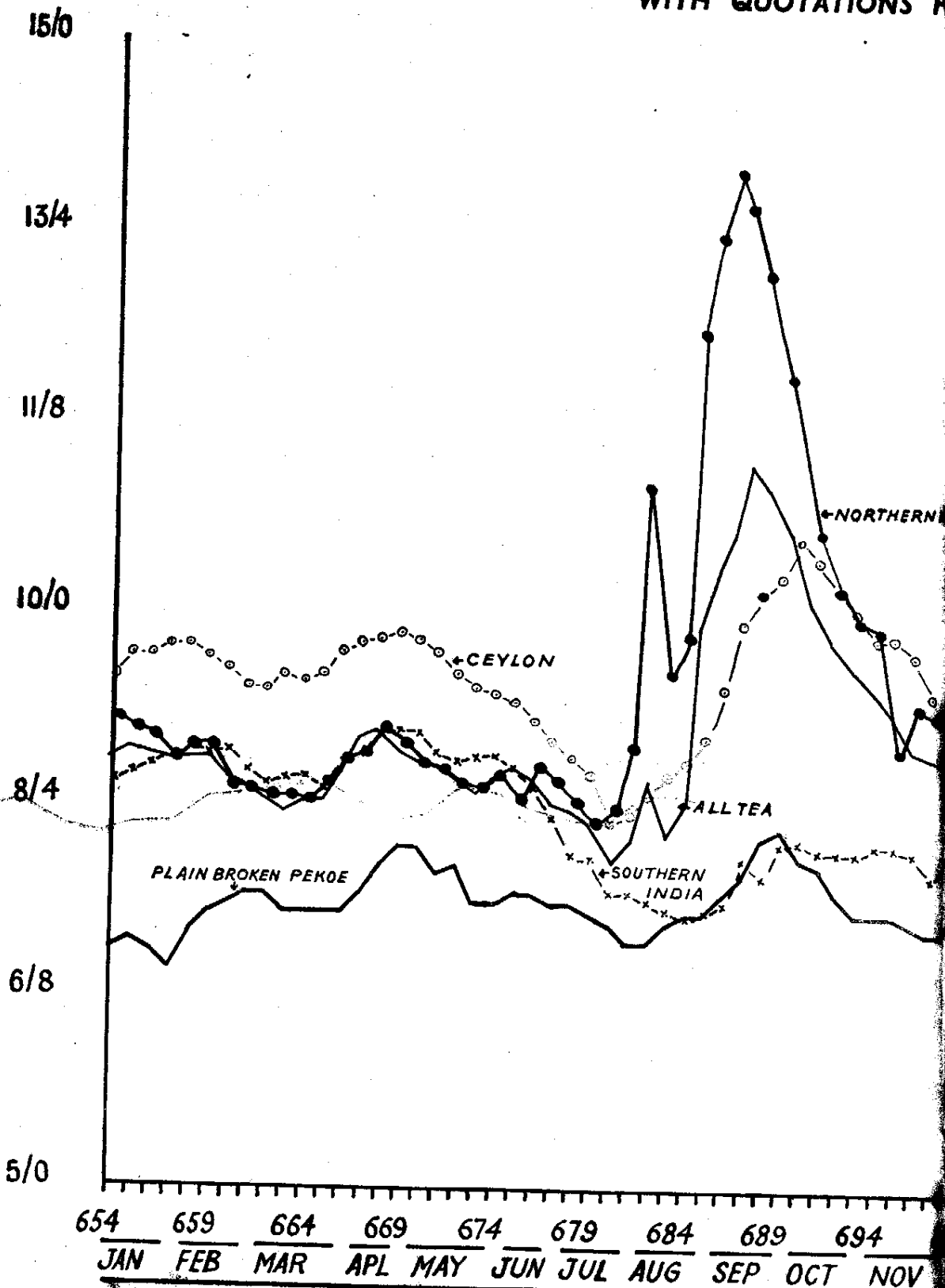
